

2+2 IN ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

A partnership between Motlow State Community College and Middle Tennessee State University

The 2+2 program is a unique partnership between Motlow State Community College (MSCC) and Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) designed to meet the professional needs of students preparing to teach at the elementary level. Students in the program will complete four years of study and receive a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Interdisciplinary Studies with an emphasis in K-6. The first two years of the program are completed by earning an Associate of Science in Teaching (A.S.T.) degree at MSCC. The successful student will earn the Bachelor of Science and licensure in Elementary Education K-6.



What is the Associate of Science in Teaching (A.S.T.)?

The A.S.T. degree has been implemented throughout the Tennessee Board of Regents

(TBR) system to facilitate entry of transfer students from community colleges into university teacher education programs. A common curriculum is applicable to all community colleges and acceptable at all TBR universities as prescribed.

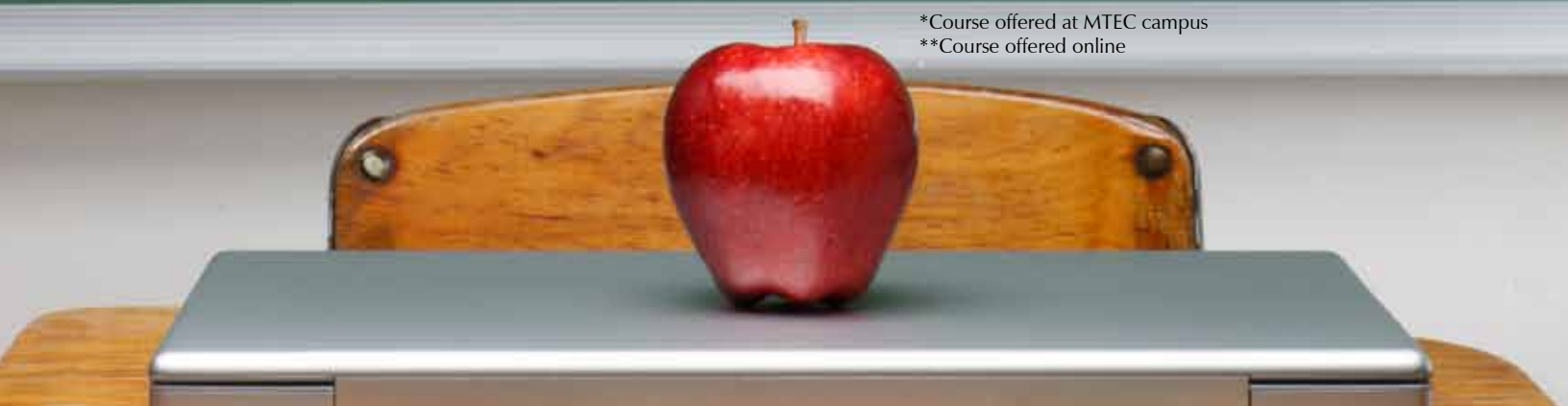

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

Step 1:

Apply to Motlow State Community College (MSCC) or Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) depending on your academic progress. Apply for admission to Motlow State Community College by obtaining an application form from any MSCC campus location or online at www.mscc.edu/admissions/apply.html. To apply for admission to Middle Tennessee State University, go to www.mtsu.edu/admissn.

If you have questions about applying to either MSCC or MTSU, call the Middle Tennessee Education Center (MTEC) at (931) 685-4444. MTEC is located at 841 Union Street, Shelbyville, TN 37160 (behind the old hospital).

Step 2:

Send an unofficial copy of transcripts from all colleges and universities you previously attended to MTEC. You may bring transcripts in person, send them by mail, fax them to (931) 685-4555, or send them as an email attachment to Molly Culbreath at mculbrea@mtsu.edu. An unofficial evaluation will be done to determine where you are academically.

Official transcripts will need to be sent to the appropriate school upon admission.

Step 3:

Set an appointment with an appropriate advisor from either MSCC or MTSU.
